The text also highlights the historical significance of Edel Quinn, who established the Legion in Uganda in 1938 at Nkokonjeru Parish, now a spiritual hub for annual pilgrimages. Christ the King Parish in Kampala is noted as another vital center of Legionary activity. The movement's future includes a

call to embrace digital evangelization, as Pope Francis has encouraged, to reach the younger generation. Overall, the Rosary remains a pillar of the Legion's mission, offering a way of life centered on prayer and service.
